The World of Standing Rules, Just Rules, Recommendations and Bylaws

For those of you who did and did not participate in our February 10, 2023, meeting I will tell you it included a multi hour debate on many topics. Some business was completed. Some business will continue at our March meeting. I encourage everyone to bring a copy of the Bylaws included in this article to the March meeting to facilitate our conversation.

Everyone is of course encouraged to speak and participate. Words will be accepted as the perspective and opinion of the individual speaking and of equal weight as the perspective or opinion of any other member. An approval by the majority determines the actions to be taken. When it comes to the law, the basic pattern used in our society is that things that are not specifically prohibited are legal. Therefore; a list of all the things allowed in any area does not exist.

The issue with BCC emails was tabled. Proposed changes to standing rules that were approved included rules for speaking at meetings, a statement that Districts can advise Clubs but not direct them, Presidents may invite people to the Executive Committee meetings, fewer free yearbooks will be given and actual costs of yearbooks/flash drives will be passed on to members. The first seven proposed changes to Bylaws were reviewed. Two proposals were eliminated.

Seven more Bylaws will be summarized at the March meeting. Proposals were developed based on requests from a variety of members for a more open elections process and a more informed voting membership. Those to be discussed are:

Article XIII - Elections

<u>Proposed adding Section 7:</u> The order of the names of candidates that are printed on the ballot will be determined by a chance drawing. The drawing shall be witnessed and certified by the members of the Nominating Committee.

<u>Rationale:</u> Voters who do not have a preference typically vote for the first name on a ballot. Roberts Rules suggests that to avoid position bias the order of the names on a ballot should be determined by a random process.

<u>If amended will then read:</u> The order of the names of candidates that are printed on the ballot will be determined by a chance drawing. The drawing shall be witnessed and certified by the members of the Nominating Committee.

Article XIII - Elections

<u>Proposed adding Section 8:</u> All members seeking an elected office in the San Gabriel Valley District of Women's Clubs/SGVD will be given an opportunity to give a two (2) minute speech on their qualifications to members of the Executive Board the meeting prior to the election.

Rationale: To ensure delegates have an opportunity to learn about the candidate prior to the election in order to make a more informed decision. To ensure candidates have an opportunity to tell members about their qualifications before a vote is taken.

<u>If amended will then read:</u> All members seeking an elected office in the San Gabriel Valley District of Women's Clubs/SGVD will be given an opportunity to give a two (2) minute speech on their qualifications to members of the Executive Board the meeting prior to the election.

Article XIII - Elections

<u>Proposed adding Section 9</u>: All members seeking an elected office in the San Gabriel Valley District of Women's Clubs/SGVD be required to provide to the Nominating Committee a Candidate Statement that includes: Name, Club affiliations, Years in Federation; positions held at the Club level; positions held in the San Gabriel Valley District/SGVD, positions held at the General Federation of Women's Clubs/GFWC - California Federation of Women's Clubs/CFWC, position the candidate is running for and a candidate statement of up to 250 words. The Nominating Committee shall create a document containing all of the Candidate Statements and email them to all delegates no later than one (1) week prior to the election.

Rationale: To ensure delegates have an opportunity to learn about the candidate prior to the election in order to make a more informed decision.

<u>If amended will then read</u>: All members seeking an elected office in the San Gabriel Valley District of Women's Clubs/SGVD be required to provide to the Nominating Committee a Candidate Statement that includes: Name, Club affiliations, Years in Federation; positions held at the Club level; positions held in the San Gabriel Valley District/SGVD, positions held at the General Federation of Women's Clubs/GFWC - California Federation of Women's Clubs/CFWC, position the candidate is running for and a candidate statement of up to 250 words. The Nominating Committee shall create a document containing all of the Candidate Statements and email them to all delegates no later than one (1) week prior to the election.

Article XIII – Elections <u>Proposed adding Section 12:</u> Any candidate that is nominated from the floor on the day of the Election will have the opportunity to give a two (2) minute speech on their qualifications and provide their candidate statement to delegates at the meeting at which they are nominated.

Rationale: To ensure delegates have an opportunity to learn about the candidate prior to the election in order to make a more informed decision.

<u>If amended will then read:</u> Any candidate that is nominated from the floor on the day of the Election will have the opportunity to give a two (2) minute speech on their qualifications and provide their candidate statement to delegates at the meeting at which they are nominated.

Article XV- State Endorsements

Proposed added Section 2 and renumbering sections as needed. Members of the San Gabriel Valley District requesting the Executive Committee consider endorsing a member including themselves for a CFWC or GFWC position shall submit to the Executive Committee a Candidate Statement that includes: Name, Club affiliations, Years in Federation; positions held at the Club level; positions held in the San Gabriel Valley District/SGVD, positions held at the General Federation of Women's Clubs/GFWC - California Federation of Women's Clubs/CFWC, position the candidate is running for and a candidate statement of up to 250 words.

Rationale: To ensure Executive Committee members have an opportunity to learn about the candidate prior to the Committee's approval of writing a letter of endorsement.

<u>If amended will then read</u>: Members of the San Gabriel Valley District requesting the Executive Committee consider endorsing a member including themselves for a CFWC or GFWC position shall submit to the Executive Committee a Candidate Statement that includes: Name, Club affiliations, Years in Federation; positions held at the Club level; positions held in the San Gabriel Valley District/SGVD, positions held at the General Federation of Women's Clubs/GFWC - California Federation of Women's Clubs/CFWC, position the candidate is running for and a candidate statement of up to 250 words.

Proposed added Section 3 and renumbering sections as needed. After the Executive Committee has completed the process for approving the writing of a letter of endorsement for a CFWC or GFWC position, if an additional person(s) make a request for a letter of endorsement at an Executive Board meeting, all potential members to be endorsed will have the opportunity to give a 2 minute speech prior to any vote being taken by the Board to approve the submission of a letter of endorsement on behalf of the SGVD.

Rationale: To ensure voting delegate have an opportunity to learn about the candidate prior to the Committee's approval of writing a letter of endorsement.

If amended will read: After the Executive Committee has completed the process for approving the writing of a letter of endorsement for a CFWC or GFWC position, if an addition person(s) make a request for a letter of endorsement at an Executive Board meeting, all potential members to be endorsed will have the opportunity to give a 2 minute speech prior to any vote being taken by the Board to approve the submission of a letter of endorsement on behalf of the SGVD.

Article XVI – Amendments

Proposed adding Section 3: The Bylaws may be amended at the Convention by a two thirds vote of delegates in attendance.

Rationale: There is currently no language that defines the vote necessary to approve proposed changes to Bylaws.

If amended will then read: The Bylaws may be amended at the Convention by a two thirds vote of delegates in attendance.

- •Participation in the local PTA and attending school board meetings.
- •Setting up "Meet the Author" Program(s.)

- Participating in Red Cross Blood Drives


