At times we all love a good argument. In organizations that good argument has a purpose--to ensure members have an equal opportunity to express their opinion while ensuring that decisions can be made in a timely fashion. In order to accomplish this real purpose for the debate we need an established procedure, a Chair that guides the group to adhere to the procedure and members who know and follow the rules so that the trains run on time. I have spoken about this in past articles.

We start with the main motion and a second, then the real work begins. Do we follow the established procedure, say our opinion and vote? Do we use: postpone, amend, appeal, rescind or reconsider to get to a better solution? If you are walking out of meetings feeling frustrated, I bet the answer to these questions is no.

When debate devolves into a street fight remember:

- Someone can be recognized and Call for the Question which is voted on without debate and if 2/3 of the members agree, the debate stops and a vote is taken.
- Debate is not permitted after the voting begins.
- After the debate has ended it can only be resumed with a unanimous vote even if the vote on the main motion was inconclusive.
- It is probably time to schedule a training session on the agreed upon structure of debates for a future meeting.
- Take the personal out of the equation.

- Work on informal ways to allow those who dissent to feel heard or be more fully informed as to the details they may have an issue with.
- Clubs can ask the District for assistance. Districts can ask area vice presidents and State officers for assistance.
- There is always an accountant or a lawyer that will take your money to give you advise.

Ultimately, nothing ensures everyone agrees with the decisions that are made. One basic concept that is needed for a group to function is to radically accept nothing will ever be perfect, sometimes we get what we want, sometimes we don't and the needs of the group require members to support or at the very least acquiesce to the will of the majority. Then have a glass of wine and relax!

It has been my pleasure serving as your Women's History and Resource Center Chair for 2020 to 2022. As I write this farewell, I am suffering from Covid (written in May). I am on the mend but wanted to get this article to the Key, prior to the deadline. It is 11:55 PM. I will continue to be in touch with you throughout the year. I have a few articles to still share with you, so you have not heard the last from me. (*Forward Into Light*, Kim)

Did you know that the first two Black employees at Boeing were women? In 1942, <u>Florise Spearman and</u> <u>Dorothy West Williams</u> were hired in the wake of many young male employees leaving to serve the country during World War II. These women picked up where they left off, Spearman as a stenographer and West Williams as a sheet metal worker assembling airplanes. West Williams was the first Black production worker at Boeing and a union member of Local 751. Many have since followed the trail they blazed with <u>over half of Boeing's wartime workers being women</u>, and 10% of those women being Black.

Website: Fascinate https://www.factinate.com/ Virginia Hall was considered the "most dangerous of all allied spies" by the Germans, who referred to her as "The Limping Lady" due to her wooden leg. She worked behind German lines for over 30 years and is the most successful female spy ever to have worked for the OSS (precursor to the CIA). After WWII, she was the only female civilian to be recognized for her service and was awarded the Distinguished Service Cross from OSS director General Donovan. Sybil Ludington was the daughter of Colonel Henry Ludington and is a celebrated hero of the American Revolutionary war. Her rise to fame occurred when she got on her horse to warn Colonial forces of British forces approached, riding twice the distance of her male counterpart Paul Revere.
