Objective: To encourage and reward clubs for improvement projects that meet the changing needs of their communities. Community Improvement is not just a contest. It is a call for action to improve life in your city or town. GFWC's longest standing project, it benefits clubs by increasing membership opportunities, developing leadership skills, and creating public awareness of club activities and GFWC. Club projects that make your community a better place are community improvement projects and are eligible for national recognition and reward.

Contest covers the period January 1, 2020 to December 31, 2022.

Project Essentials:

- Identify and define community need
- Describe the project selection process
- Explain how your club engaged community support
- Define how project is financed
- Identify media support and how it was obtained
- Recount how you overcame obstacles
- Provide a list of collaborating partners
- Describe club's continuing role in the project
- Explain the project's long-term effect on the community
- Identify results and successes
- Describe how the project influenced changes in your community
- Entry must include official Entry Form as published in the GFWC 2020-2022 Club Manual

Judging: Points are awarded for Project Selection, 25 points; Project Development, 50 points; and Project Evaluation 25 points. See GFWC Club Manual for complete judging criteria.

Awards: Awards will be made at State and National levels. National Awards total \$19,360.
