- 2. If you would like to have your reports reviewed for form (NOT CONTENT) please email them to Dean Linda Koontz and 2nd VP Membership Lu Arredondo prior to January 7, 2022 and they can provide feedback prior to the help desk. Or, have them ready and they can be reviewed during the help desk session. Instructions for setting an appointment during the help desk hours will be sent out with the call credentials.

- 3. Please submit your final reports to President Rosette, 1st VP Dean Linda Koontz, and 2nd VP Membership Lu Arredondo no later than January 14, 2022 at 6 pm. Please note that ALL clubs must submit a Statistical Report. Acceptable submission options are outlined below.

Happy New Year! As we look to the next 5 months, we will explore the Elements of Membership Retention we talked about in the November KEY. The first element was Friendship and Personal Interaction.

When we think of Friendship and Personal Interaction, we might find ourselves focusing on club projects, club sections, and club meetings as opportunities to enhance friendships and our personal interaction with each other. And, while these are all great opportunities to do this, the question remains "how". I would suggest getting to know your members better. A good way to do this is through Craft talks.

A craft talk is a chance for members to share more about themselves. You can be creative in how you have members share information. The talks can be on a single day, over the course of a year, and even included in your club newsletters. Be creative and place club member names in a bowl and each meeting pull 5 names out of the bowl. Have those members stand up and share with the group something about themselves that no one else knows. It could be something they like to do outside of Federation, a place they traveled and how it made them feel, something they wish the club would get involved in, etc. you can also place random questions in a bowl and have them choose one of the questions to answer. The key is to engage in conversation as a group. Is there something in what is shared that the club can include as a project?

As an example, I love to write Christmas cards to our men and women overseas, to thank them for their service and to let them know that the Arredondo Family is missing them and appreciates all they are sacrificing so that we can be home celebrating the holidays with loved ones. As a way to engage my passion, the Woman's Club of West Covina coordinated a card writing program and during one of our general meetings every member in attendance signed and wrote notes in 5 cards each. The project didn't take long, but by the time we were done, we had over 300 cards to mail to those serving abroad. While we completed the task, members shared stories and engaged in a way that would not have occurred during the course of a regular meeting.

Let us make a pact to spend 2022 engaging our membership and sharing ideas with all our sister clubs! Remember, it is in our sharing that we, as an organization, become stronger.

So, You want to Speak at a Meeting

Let me begin by restating the purpose of Roberts Rules of Order: To create a structure where members of the group are given an equal opportunity to express their views, are treated with respect by all and the group can make the necessary decisions to carry out their business.

The first step is ask to be recognized by the Chair. The Chair may ask you why. It is a common practice that unless the group has established rules, each member may speak twice on a motion for 10 minutes. It is also common practice for the speakers in a debate to be rotated between for and against the issue being considered. In order to allow everyone to participate after someone has

shared their opinion, all others who want to speak are given the opportunity before a person can speak for a second time. Remember, there is no third bite at the apple unless the group changes that rule.

The time limits for a discussion can be modified with the adoption of Standing Rules that are different than the common practice. They can also be changed just for a specific motion. A motion to <u>Limit Debate</u> can be made when no other motion is on the floor. It can define the time for each speaker, the total time for the debate, the total number of speakers etc. This is generally passed by unanimous consent, if not it requires a 2/3 vote. This motion needs a second, is not debatable, is amendable, but the amendments are not debatable.

Let's say there is already a motion on the floor that is being debated and it has gone on and on and on. A member can be recognized by the Chair and say: <u>I Move the Previous Question</u> and then propose to end the debate. This needs a second, can be debated, cannot be amended and needs a majority vote. When the debate on this secondary motion takes place, the conversation is limited to talking about ending or not ending the debate on the main motion. Members are not allowed to incorporate their position of the main motion into this debate.

Let's say someone else was given an opportunity to speak and you believe it really was your turn or a speaker has continued to talk past their time limit or the speaker just started talking without being recognized. You can interrupt the speaker and make a <u>Point of Order</u>. You state your concern and what rule(s) was violated and the Chair makes the decision of who can speak.

The purpose of requiring members to be recognized before speaking, Point of Order (can interrupt the speaker), motion to Limit Debate (must be recognized before speaking) and Order the Previous Question (must be recognized before using) are tools meant to ensure members have an equal opportunity to express their opinion and that decisions can be made in a timely fashion.

GFWC Mediator Program

Terry Perkins was chosen to be trained as GFWC Mediators to help clubs with conflict resolution and mediation. Sometimes issues arise that require a more considered approach. For these cases, GFWC Mediators can serve as an impartial listener, and provide thoughtful feedback and assistance in developing a resolution strategy. All interaction with a GFWC Mediator is kept confidential. It is important to note that GFWC Mediators are not able to provide legal advice and cannot legally negotiate between parties, nor is any participant bound by the recommendations of a GFWC Mediator.

You can share your ideas, thoughts, and opinions during the time for "Public Comments"—usually limited to three minutes maximum. You can express via snail mail, e-mail, online, and even view many School Board Meetings Live.

Although, you may not have children in school now, you still pay hefty property taxes to support our public schools. The value of your home is largely based on how well your local schools perform. You we all are "stakeholders," much to gain...much to lose.

To be well-informed about the state of education in California, in other states, and even in other countries, there is a wonderful free source—a web-site: Ed100.org. Ed100.org is posted and hosted by our California PTA (capta.org.)

You may even join your local PTA to help out; and you do not even have to have children in school. PTA's can improve greatly by community volunteers, especially us Women's Club's Members. We have so much to share based on life experience—the best teacher of all.

Presently, there is great controversy about the curriculum being offered in our public schools. California has now mandated "ethnic studies" for all public high school students, community college students, and university students. Each school district has the obligation to develop it's own "ethnic studies" curriculum. Already, there are criticisms that many ethnicities are not being included. Many people are arguing strongly that all ethnicities must be included and never excluded. All ethnicities are of equal value as stated in our nation's motto and printed on our nation's currency: *e pluribus unum*.

A very controversial curriculum item is Critical Race Theory (CRT). You are encouraged to research CRT and review the pros and cons. We all need to be included and well informed in the conversation about CRT. I hope you are all working on your club histories. Start simple – select a historic woman in your club, write a short biography on her, and share it with me. Project Idea: Just last week the Covina Woman's Club came up with a new history project. A group from the club will be working on discovering the names and history of the women in their club that served (officially or unofficially) in the military since 1898. They have expanded their endeavors to include these member's mothers, grandmothers, grand-daughters and close female relatives. Once identified and documented the club plans on honoring these women's memories at special events, and on special recognition days. This will be an exciting project and I know that this is not all we will discover. We have already located four members – two actual members and two member's mothers, one of which was a Covina Woman's Club member.

If any club is interested in learning how to research alongside us, you are welcome to attend our planning meetings in 2020 – yet to be scheduled.

SPOTLIGHT – Mrs. Edgar John Summerhayes – Monday Afternoon Club/Covina Woman's Club, 1930's

The club's research on Mrs. Summerhayes has just begun, but what we have discovered thus far is that she was a member of the club in the 1930's. She was Curator of the club Radio Section. On April 19,1937 at 3:30 PM, "Across This Threshold," a one- act play, written by Mrs. Summerhays was presented over radio station KFAC (apparently a popular radio station located on Hollywood Blvd. with beautiful towers). The program was sponsored by the Los Angeles County Federation of Women's Clubs. A half-hour time slot was given to Mrs. Summerhays.

KFAC was the first of its kind to have been organized in the state and gained wide recognition through the efforts of Mrs. Summerhayes. According to the *Covina Argus*, "This is the first time that an original play,

cast with club members, was performed, and has created interest throughout the district." The play won second place in a contest, the previous year.

I did some quick research on Mrs. Summerhayes via the Internet and found a few small items; however, my history resource on "Everything Covina", member Arline Payne, provided me with some great leads. I think Mrs. Summerhayes will eventually lead us on a colorful journey through the history of our club, community and era.

Did your club have a Curator of the Radio Section? I am sure they did, and you might even find a reference to the play Mrs. Summerhayes wrote in your files. I will continue my quest to find more information, and if any of you know anything about Mrs. Summerhayes, please contact me. Wouldn't it be fun if we could find a copy of the play? Just think of the possibilities!
